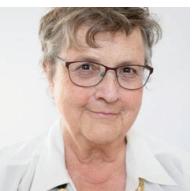
NORMAN DOIDGE (Canada): The Brain's Way of Healing

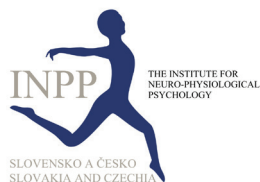
The languages of the conference are **English, Slovak** and **Hungarian** with **simultaneous translation**.
